At the 2025 Grand Lodge of California Annual Communication, the following resolutions and recommendations were among those **passed and adopted**:

- **Master Mason Proficiency Requirement:** A resolution requiring Masons to complete their Master Mason proficiency *before* being nominated to the offices of master, senior warden, or junior warden (Resolution No. 24-01) passed with a 78.73% vote.
- Grand Lodge Officer Titles: Resolution No. 25-04, which changed the titles of Grand Organist, Assistant Grand Organist, and Organist to Grand Musician, Assistant Grand Musician, and Musician, was passed.
- Electronic Membership Cards: A resolution authorizing the issuance of electronic membership cards that all lodges must recognize was passed.
- **Restoration Period for Suspended Masons:** A recommendation (Grand Master's Recommendation No. 5) to extend the restoration repayment period for Masons suspended for non-payment of dues from two years to three years has passed.
- Centralized Suspensions: A recommendation was passed to centralize the notification process for suspensions due to non-payment of dues, moving the responsibility from individual lodge secretaries to the Grand Lodge's centralized system.
- Committee Structure Updates: Grand Master's Recommendation No. 1, which updated the rules around membership, duties, and tenure for several Grand Lodge committees, was approved.

A resolution to allow the Cicero Research Lodge to hold a single stated meeting annually during the Annual Communication (Resolution No. 25-02) was also on the agenda, but its specific outcome (passed or failed) was not detailed in the provided summaries.

In addition to the Master Mason proficiency requirement, the following resolutions and recommendations were among those **passed** at the 2025 Grand Lodge of California Annual Communication:

- Electronic Membership Cards A resolution authorizing the issuance of electronic membership cards was adopted, requiring lodges to recognize them in the same manner as traditional paper cards.
- Stated Meetings in the First-Degree A resolution to permit lodges to hold their stated (business) meetings in the first degree was passed. This change allows Entered Apprentices (EA) and Fellow Crafts (FC) to attend lodge business meetings.
- Centralized Suspensions A Grand Master's Recommendation (No. 3) to centralize the notification and administrative
 process for suspensions due to non-payment of dues, moving the primary responsibility from individual lodge
 secretaries to the Grand Lodge system, was passed.
- **Restoration Period for Suspended Masons** Grand Master's Recommendation No. 5, which lengthens the restoration repayment period for Masons suspended for non-payment of dues from two years to three years, was adopted.
- Elimination of Officer Associations Grand Master's Recommendation No. 2, which eliminates outdated code provisions relating to officers' associations (which are rare today), was passed.
- Cicero Research Lodge Meetings Resolution 25-02, allowing the newly formed Cicero Research Lodge to hold a single stated meeting annually during the Annual Communication, was passed.
- Grand Lodge Officer Titles Resolution 25-04, changing the titles of Grand Organist, Assistant Grand Organist, and Organist to Grand Musician, Assistant Grand Musician, and Musician, was passed.
- **Budget and Fees** The 2025-2026 budget was adopted, and the per capita assessment was fixed at \$68.50. The background check fee was set at \$40.00.
